### Bourbon 101 with Jim Guynn (No Fee – Limit 8 per session)

This is a tasting and history lesson in which you will learn the definition and history of bourbon and a little about how it is made. You will learn the meaning of bourbon terms such as “bottled in bond”, “straight”, “single barrel”, “small batch”, “finished”, etc. You will have the opportunity to taste five bourbons that are usually available at ABC stores in Virginia as an introduction to the factors that affect the taste of bourbon. There will be a discussion of the “bourbon boom” and what to look for in the premium bourbon world. Jim has been certified as an Executive Bourbon Steward by the Stave and Thief Society of Louisville Kentucky and hosted numerous bourbon tastings in the past year. It will last about 60 minutes. There will be two seatings for the tasting – **2:30 pm and 3:45 pm with a limit of 8 per seating.**
